The interactive Constituency Map displays the 18 constituencies for the Northern Ireland Assembly elections. The pie charts compare the party share of votes in each area during the 2007 and 2011 Assembly elections. Photographs of the 6 MLAs elected in each constituency can also be viewed.



## How to Use the Multimedia


Use this resource to help analyse the performance of the political parties in the last two Assembly elections. The photographs and party names of the MLAs elected in each constituency can also be viewed.

#### Click on:

- a constituency on the map to view pie charts comparing the party share of votes for that area in the 2007 and 2011 Assembly elections;
- the View MLAs arrow below the pie charts to view photographs of the 6 MLAs elected in that constituency; and
- the Links icon above the map to access further research papers on election results or the Assembly parties websites.

#### Roll over:

- constituency names to highlight any constituency on the map; or
- party names to enlarge a segment of the pie chart for a particular party.
