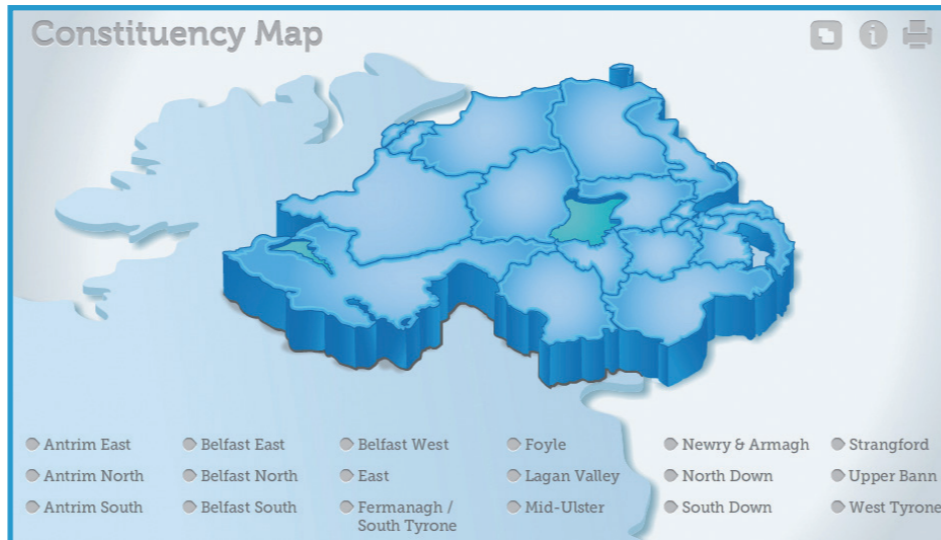

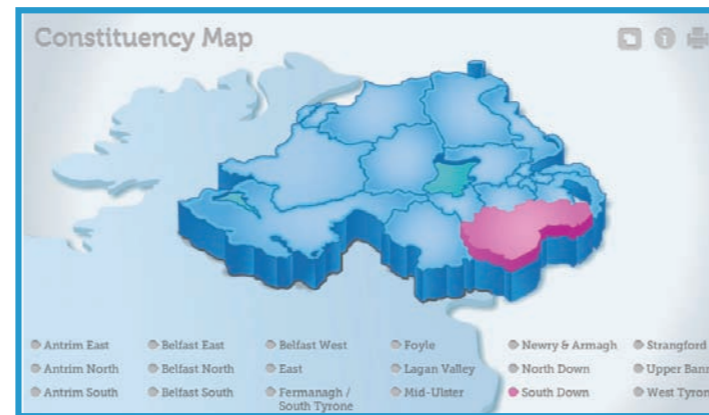

The interactive Constituency Map displays the 18 constituencies for the Northern Ireland Assembly elections. Have the pupils use the map to explore MLAs in different constituencies.



## How to Use the Multimedia

Regular, free and fair elections are a principle of democracy. You can use this resource to help explore elections to the Northern Ireland Assembly and the role of our elected representatives.

To use the map:

- roll over a constituency name to highlight that constituency on the map; and
- click on a constituency to view the photographs of the MLAs elected in that constituency.
