Evolution of Devolution is an interactive timeline of events 1900–1999, culminating in the establishment of the Northern Ireland Assembly. Each symbol contains information about the event it represents. Have the pupils search to find an archive photograph or video clip where available. The timeline concludes with a summary of the first decade of devolution, 2000–2010.



## How to Use the Multimedia

Use Evolution of Devolution to investigate:

- a particular period of study; or
- milestone events influencing the model of devolution we have today.

Roll over the symbols on the pages of the book for summary information about that event.

#### Click on:

- each symbol for more in-depth information and any media related to that event;
- photographs or video clips to enlarge and reduce size;
- the forward/back arrows around the dates to navigate each screen; and
- the scroll bar below the dates drag to jump to a particular point on the timeline.
