N: The Northern Ireland Assembly Committee for Culture, Arts and Leisure is holding an Inquiry on maximising the potential of the Creative Industries in Northern Ireland. We caught up with Committee Chair, Michelle McIlveen to find out more. Michelle, can you tell us a bit more about why the Committee has decided to carry out this Inquiry?

MM: The Committee recognises the significant economic and social contribution that the Creative Industries can make. With the sector's potential to boost the economy and job market, the Committee wants to ensure that the right conditions are in place to stimulate growth and development, particularly in these hard economic times. The Committee is keen to hear from people from the Creative Industries as part of its Inquiry. From high tech computer design companies to the more traditional forms of arts and crafts, the Committee wants to hear from you about what should be done to help the Creative Industries advance and thrive.

MM: The Committee would like as many people as possible to contribute to the Inquiry and we look forward to receiving all of the responses. We all know that there are some fabulous home grown talent in Northern Ireland and some amazing locally made product, and we want to support and encourage the growth of these Creative Industries for the benefit of the Northern Ireland economy.
