1 Introduction

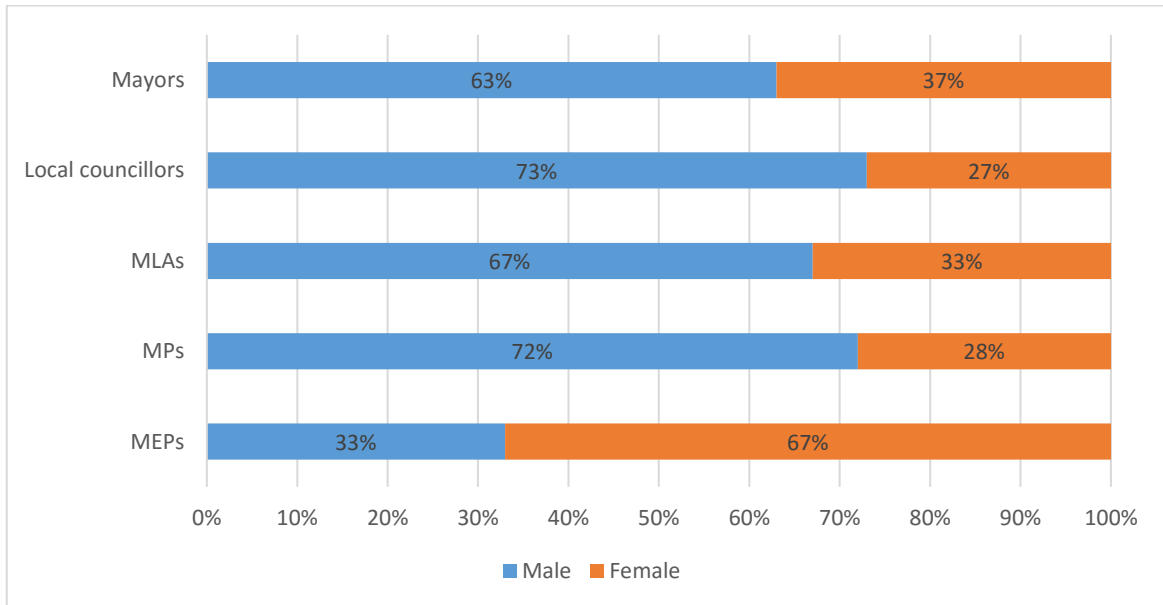

The statistics are set out in simplified tables to offer an at-a-glance view of gender and power in Northern Ireland.

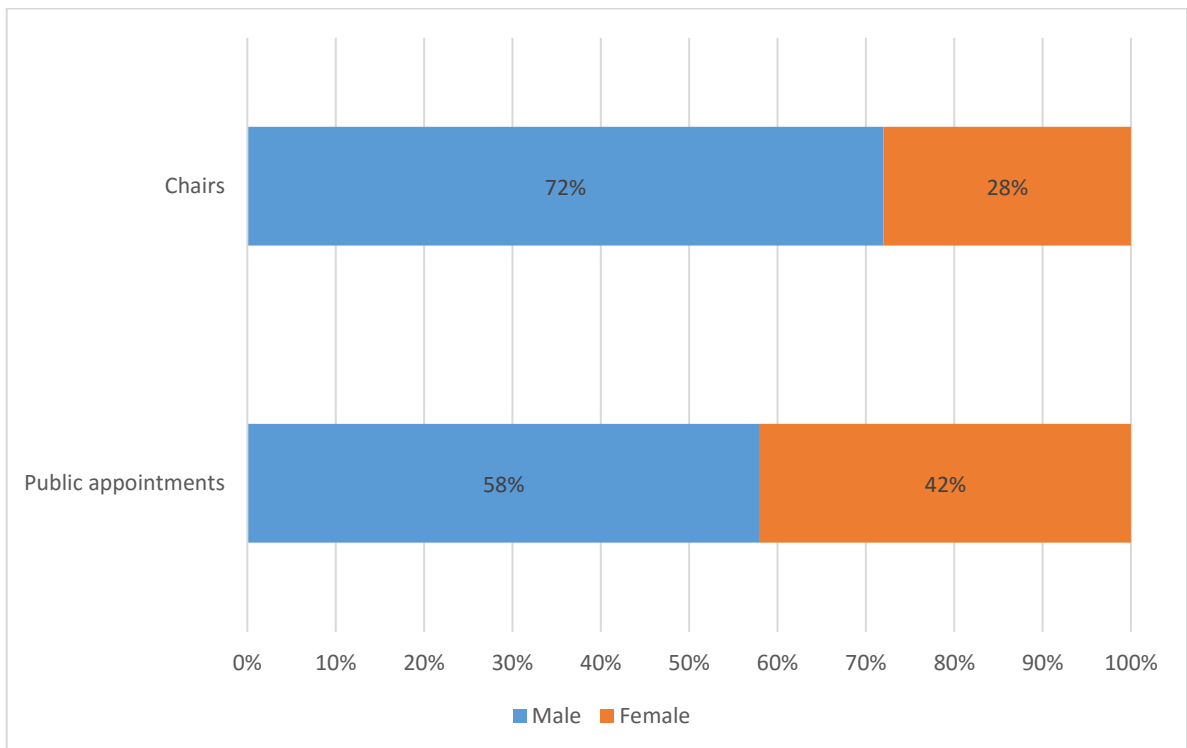

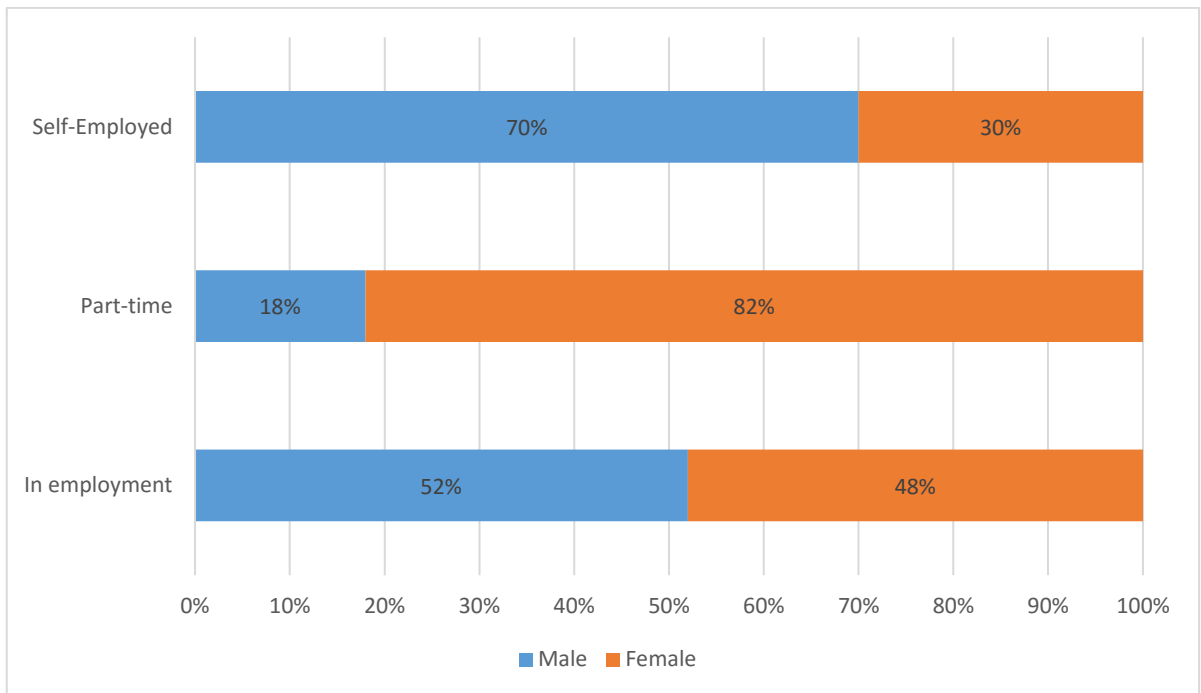

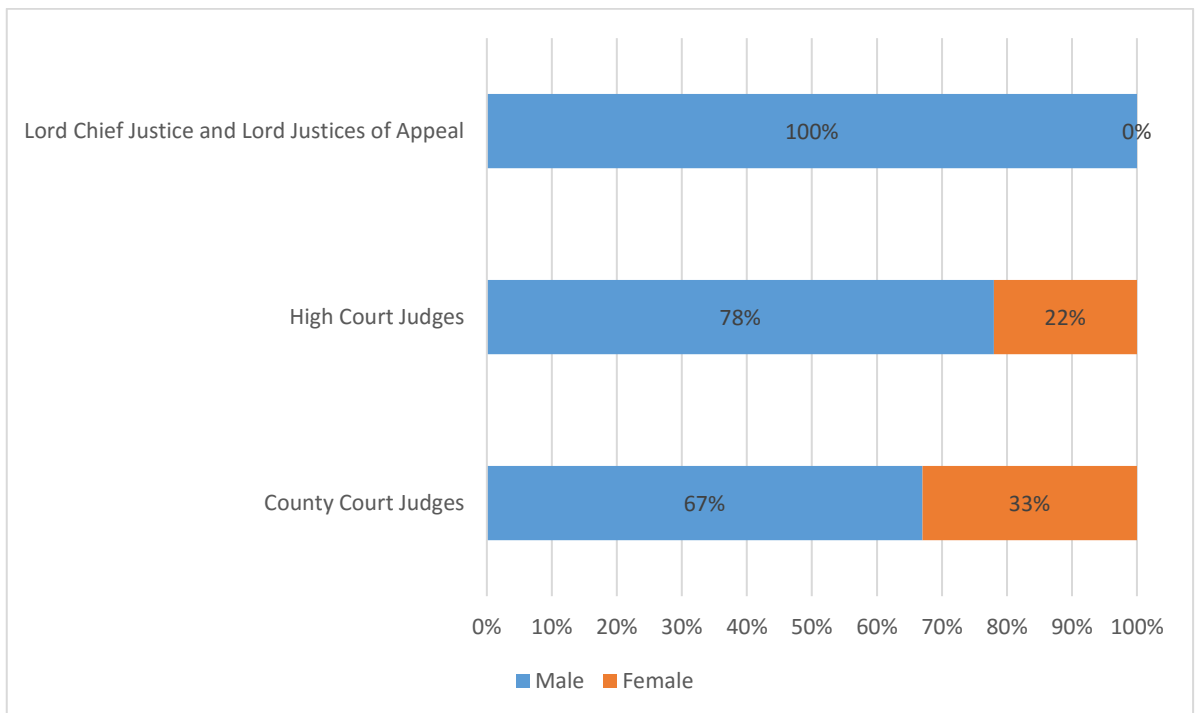

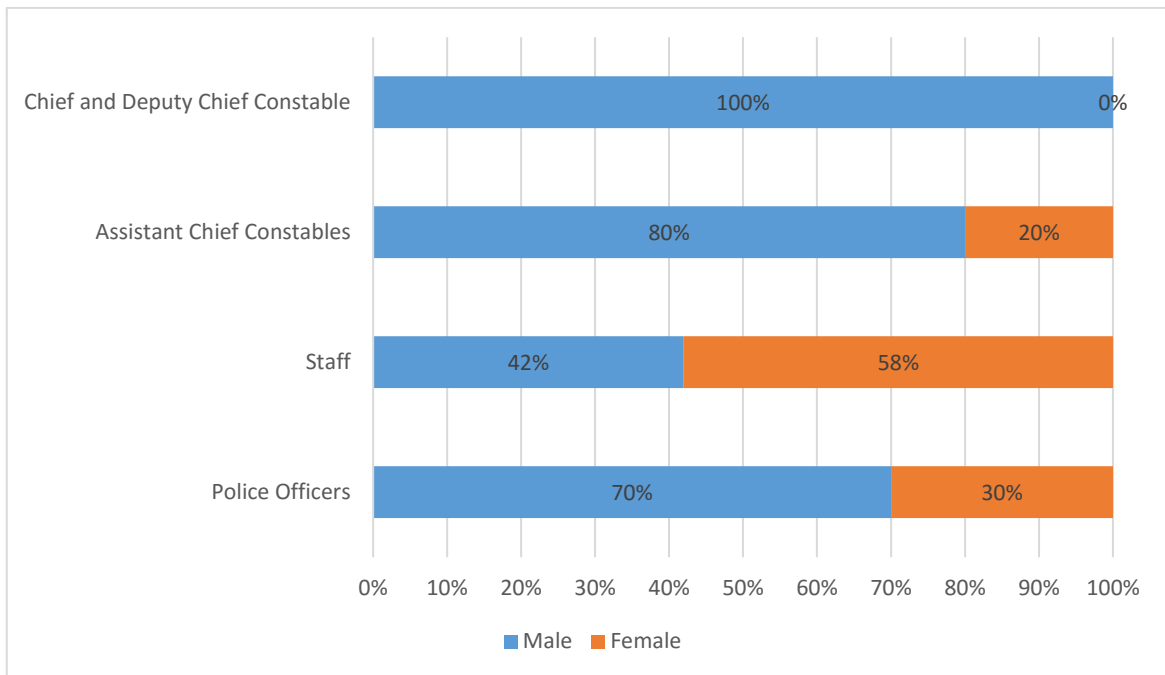

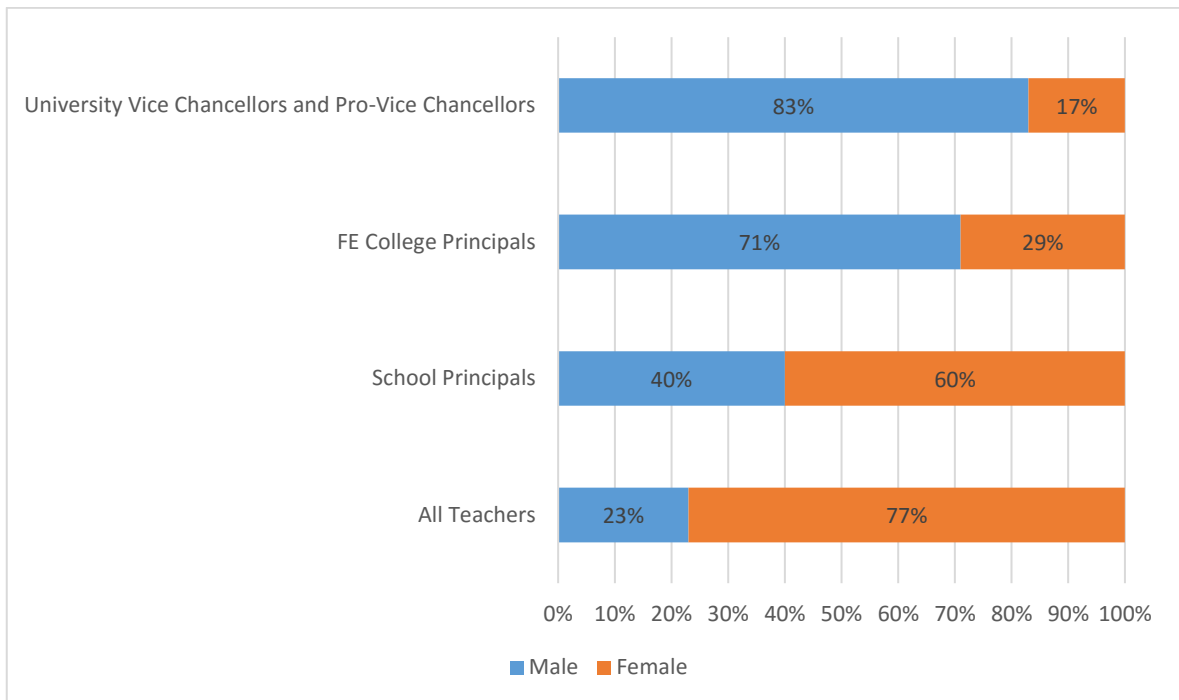

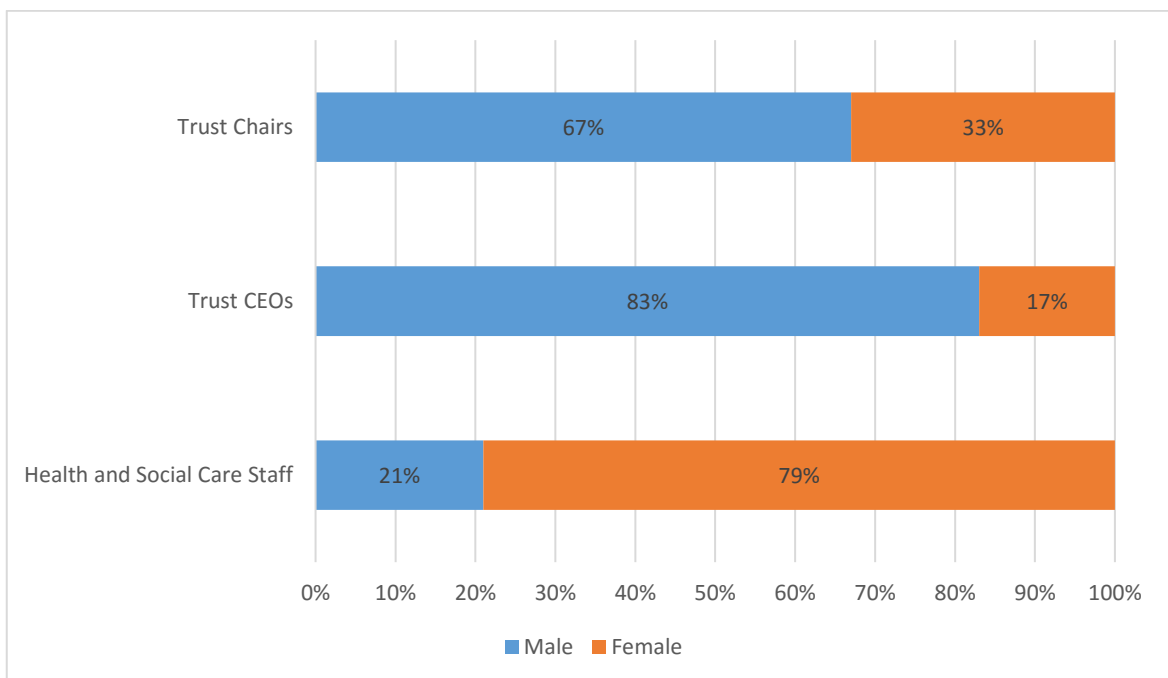
